

Our seasoned experts have wandered extensively in the South, and recommend favorite towns there where seniors can find relaxation and enjoyment without spending a lot of money. Warning: If you enjoy peace and quiet, don't show up at these towns during spring break time. They'll be full of loud and rowdy students. However, at other times of the year, particularly autumn, consider:

South Padre Island TX: The 100-mile stretch of sandy beaches is south on the Gulf of Mexico between Corpus Christi and the Mexican border. It boasts year-round tropical weather, and is great for swimming, surfing, fishing and boating. Visitors can see undisturbed flocks of sea gulls, pelicans, plover, falcons and other species at the island's National Bird Sanctuary.

St. Augustine FL: Spanish explorer Ponce de Leon arrived 400 years ago looking for the fountain of youth. Retiree travelers and residents still make the same search. It has cobblestone streets, quaint shops, cozy restaurants and buggy rides.

Pinehurst NC: A National Landmark town, with 40 golf courses within a 10-minute drive. There are lakes for fishing, boating and other activities.

Warm Springs GA: It was FDR's summer home, and his Little White House is now a popular tourist destination. The Institute for Rehabilitation, founded by FDR, provides care for paralysis patients. The quaint town and surrounding hills offer fishing, golfing, biking and nature trails, with many visitor facilities at Roosevelt State Park.
